You may recall the previous works which included areas such as the amazing Woodland Area which our EYFS children enjoy on a weekly basis. The updates within the Fruit Garden, and in particular the exciting Dome which houses a fig tree as well as many other plants. We also invested in having two libraries so that every child can spend quality time in the library and choose their own book to take home. The Holodeck (virtual learning experience) has been a fabulous

We were all amazed!

Year 4 Memorable Experience

For Year 4's Romans memorable experience, the children pretended they were Roman soldiers. They marched to Greenhead Park with their supplies (rucksack with water and snack). Upon reaching the destination, the children took part in 3 activities. The first activity was to finalise their Roman dance routines which they have been working on with a PE specialist. Thereafter, the children did some circuit training to strengthen themselves, as soldiers would have done in the Roman army.





The final activity was linked with a design technology module (which will be completed later in the year), where children will be creating a pavilion. In preparation for this, the children took the opportunity to look at an actual pavilion and analysed it by walking in and around the structure.

Year 5 Memorable Experience



Year 5 had a visit to Huddersfield fire station for a Safety Rangers Day and all had a fantastic time. They learnt about road and fire safety, healthy eating, anti-social behaviour and who they could ask for help in the community.





Y5 also enjoyed their trip to Bagshaw Museum. They handled real ancient Egyptian artifacts; recreated the mummification process; toured the Kingdom of Osiris, and engaged in Egyptian role play and crafts.
