Dear Parents/Carers,

As it approaches towards the end of another successful year, I have many items to update parents on, including KS1 and KS2 SATs, Ofsted, New Build, Breakfast Club and much more.

Firstly, a massive 'Well Done' to our Year 2 and Year 6 children, for completing their SATs tests for Reading and Mathematics; and Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation for KS2 children. The children and staff have worked extremely hard all year in preparation for the tests and whilst they were not easy, everyone remained positive. We are so proud of you all!

Due to our excellent recent Ofsted Report, we are now able to use the Ofsted 'Good Provider' logo on our school website and stationery, in recognition of our excellent work.

Work continues to progress at a rapid pace on our new build with internal walls and electrical and plumbing almost completed on the ground floor. The external brick work has been completed and the second phase for the externals works is commencing with the cladding for the Hall and rendering for the rest of the build. We are currently working with the designers in planning internal and external signage, as well as the playground.



This is also an extremely exciting time for staff as we start to plan the fantastic resources we will need for the new build. We have an exciting ICT development plan which will include brand new smart screens for every class as well as additional computers; two libraries with new furniture, books and ICT facilities; as well as new classroom furniture.

The final half term will be another busy and exciting one as children and staff prepare for end of year assessments; report writing; our annual Aspirations and Awards Ceremony. It is also a very sad time as we say goodbye to our wonderful Year 6 children as they continue with their next school journey to High School, but before they leave, we will be looking forward to their Leaver's Assembly.

MEMORABLE EXPERIENCES

Nursery

An incubator came to nursery with 10 eggs. Now we have baby chicks! We are learning all about how chickens grow and hatch and have been taking care of our little chicks at Nursery. Our story has been the Little Red hen and we have found out about how she made bread... without any help from all the lazy farm animals.



Reception

This half term the children in Reception have been learning all about mini beasts and animals. The children have had great fun digging for worms and building our own wormeries. The children have thoroughly enjoyed having the eggs and watching them hatch into chicks in the incubator. We have learnt all about the life cycles of chickens and how to care for animals.



Year 1

This term we started by walking up to Beaumont Park with all the Year 1 children. We explored the park looking for leaves and plants then used binoculars to look for birds. It was a very cold day but we still managed to have some fun playing on the park. We took a walk down into the woods to explore the enchanted woodland to get some ideas for our topic. We had a great time exploring.



Year 2

This half term Year 2 had their memorable experience at Beaumont Park. We went on a mini beast hunt and used scientific equipment to observe them. We also went on a flower hunt identifying different flowers.



Year 3



The children in Year 3 had an exciting time in the lovely village of Castleton, visiting Treak Cliff Cavern (The home of the Blue John Stone). During the visit, we were able to complete a 'Fossil Hunt' before entering the cavern through the Tardis. Within the



caverns, we explored seven different caves which ranged from limestone to amazing stalactites and stalagmites. We were even lucky enough to see fossils in the caverns above our heads. It was such an amazing day.

Year 4

For their memorable experience Year 4 carried out a treasure hunt style activity to find names of 14 American states. This was carried out in a woodland area near school. They had to follow paths and go through the forest area to find the names of some of the States. To help them they had initials of the state. Their task was to find the name that matched the initials and the Native American tribe that lived there.



Year 5

This half term our topic is 'Scream Machine'. For our memorable experience, the Year 5 children were lucky enough to visit a theme park – Gulliver's World, Warrington. During the day, the children were able to ride a variety of roller coasters, such as pirate ships, log flumes and larger (scarier) rides! It was a great experience to show the children how forces and mechanisms work



together to make the rides more thrilling.

Year 6

Year 6 got a real taste of Mexico recently as they planned, prepared and cooked a famous, savoury, Mexican dish. The Fajitas were a huge success and children in all classes learnt the different ingredients and spices which go into the traditional, tasty food. The pupils also got a

chance to make some accompanying dishes such as salsa and guacamole to taste along with their Fajitas. All in all, Fajitas received a big thumbs up, with a number of children promising to try out the cooking at home with their own families!

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Dear Parents/Carers

Earlier in the year, I wrote to parents informing them of our Leave of Absence Policy. Following, a much publicised pupil attendance court case, the Local Authority have updated this policy. It is extremely important that parents read the following updated points from the renewed policy and carefully consider them before planning any leave of absence:

- **There is no automatic entitlement in law for children to take time off during term-time and miss their entitlement to schooling. The law states that 10 days of extended leave may be granted in exceptional circumstances; for example, if you were in the armed forces and even with this circumstance, granting authorised leave of absence is at the Headteacher's discretion.**
- **The courts take a negative view of visiting poorly grandparent(s) abroad citing that it is not exceptional to the child, but to the parent/s.**
- **School will require a copy of airlines tickets with defined return dates on. These can be provided after the initial meeting with the Headteacher if you decide to continue with your plans.**
- **If parents/carers take their child out of school and the leave has not been authorised by the Headteacher, parents may be fined (under Section 444 of the Education Act) £60.00 if paid within 28 days, rising to £120.00 if paid within 42 days. This is per parent and per child.**
- **Any unauthorised absence of 5 days (10 sessions) or more will be issued a fixed penalty notice, and there is a possibility of a fine of up to £1,000 and a criminal record for non-payment of a penalty notice should the case go to court.**
- **There is a strong possibility that your child could lose their school place and may struggle to be re-admitted upon your return. (Please note this has happened to families in our school).**
- **Our expectation is that all our pupils have 100% attendance unless the absence is authorised.**
