We released the butterflies into the wild during one of our Forest School sessions.




#### **Year 1 Memorable Experience**

In Year 1 this half term, we have been reading the book 'The Fox and the Star' by Coralie Bickford Smith. We spent some time learning facts about foxes; what they eat and what their habitat is like. We then created our own fox dens in the woodland area so that if any foxes visit Mount Pleasant they have a safe place to spend the night! The children loved making these dens as they wanted to ensure the foxes were comfortable!











#### **Year 2 Memorable Experience**

The rain finally stopped to allow the whole of Year 2 to go ahead with their trip to Beaumont Park. Before setting off, the children discussed in small groups about how we would walk to the park carefully, thinking about our road safety lessons. On the way, we used the zebra crossing, went over the train bridge and trekked up the hill, talking about the human and physical features in our local environment. Once we reached the park the children were amazed at the history and lovely views. They passed many beautiful flowers, sculptures, waterfalls and statues. Luckily, the fierce lion was sleeping as we passed!





The teachers were so impressed by the children's physical development strength as they whizzed across the monkey bars, climbed the rope ladder and had no fear as they zoomed down the slides. They also made great friends when a neighbouring school came to visit the park too. Next, it was time to refuel and have a perfect picnic on the grass. After dinner, we began the nature hunt, answered questions, looked for statues and discussed the animals and their habitats that we might see or hear in the park during the day and night, before we began the slow, tiring walk back to school.

## Year 3 Memorable Experience



For our memorable experience Year 3 visited Ilkley Manor House to learn all about the Romans. The children dressed up as Roman soldiers and marched the perimeter of the House, chanting in Latin. We then looked at the area around Ilkley and discussed why the Romans might have come to Ilkley. Children then had the opportunity to dress up as the Celts and we ended our visit by looking at artifacts that had been found in Ilkley from the Roman era.





#### **Year 4 Memorable Experience**

Year 4 had a visit from an Anglo-Saxon! We learnt about why the Anglo-Saxons came to Britain. We played Anglo-Saxon games, solved riddles and completed a quiz. In the afternoon, we learnt all about armour and battle techniques. At the end of the day we had the chance to challenge each other in spear wrestling!






It was an amazing day and everyone enjoyed it and learnt lots of facts about life in Anglo-Saxon Britain.

Reflecting on their experiences, the children shared their aspirations of becoming scientists or doctors in the future.

We are proud of our students for their bravery and enthusiasm in tackling this challenging yet rewarding activity. The added bonus was that no children were sick during the experience!



#### **School Council visit to the Mayor of Kirklees**





## **Huddersfield Town Training Ground Trip**



#### Carry My Story Project - Class 2B

As a class, we wanted to share information about our 'Carry My Story' project that we are continuing in 2B. After finding out about our own identity we are now moving onto finding out about a special visitor's identity from the project.

We began finding out about this person by opening up their identity box. It said on the letter that this person was a refugee. Some children didn't know what this meant so we watched a video (link below) by the charity 'Save The Children', to develop our understanding.

Next, we opened the identity box; inside were some photos, a key chain, a clear honey jar and a story.





As a class, we took the time to investigate this person's identity and find out about them.

His name was Ryad. He was born in Syria and came to Huddersfield as he was not safe in his country.

We took time to think about some questions that we wanted to ask him when he came to see us, such as "What was Syria like before the war? Why are you so interested in keeping bees? What would our world be like without bees?"

We couldn't wait to meet him and wanted to make sure he felt welcomed and valued within our school, so we got out our planning hats and thought of different ways we could do this. The children decided to decorate the outdoor classroom and share the work we have done.



They created posters and signs saying 'Welcome to our hive' and made him a special thank you card.

The day finally came for Ryad to visit us; we asked all our



questions. He told us what it was like to have to make the decision to seek asylum and take refuge in England and how his family left everything they owned and knew in Syria and have set up very successful businesses in Huddersfield. His family continue to help people that find themselves in a similar position. The children were amazed as he brought a new swarm of bees in a special frame to show us and named them after our school! The children were awed to see such wonderful and important creatures up close.
