


Mount Pleasant Primary School Parent Newsletter – Issue 51 October 2024

We have been trying hard to get dressed by ourselves for our PE lessons. We have loved learning about our Everywhere Bear. Year 1 Memorable Experience

Year 1 had a fabulous memorable experience! We brought our favourite toys to school and shared them with our peers. We discussed why our toys are special to us and how we related them to our new book 'Toys in Space'.



Year 2 Memorable Experience

To celebrate the end of our Healthy cooking topic, most of Year 2 managed to visit Swillington farm. At the farm the children split into groups to safely explore the working farm. One group went up to the orchard, harvested many apples from the trees and then worked hard to prepare them to make fresh apple juice. All children had a job, washing, transporting, cutting, churning and then pressing the apples in the machine. The children pressed just over 2 litres of fresh apple juice to try. They then explored the poly tunnels where they picked salad leaves and tomatoes to bring back to school to use in class. All children said it was the best they had ever tasted! After a quick lunch stop, the groups swapped over to the second activity where they set off to explore the farm animals. The children took apples to the cows, explored the pigs and sheep, and fed carrots to the goats. They also got the chance to stroke the goats. Finally the children passed by the ponies and then went to collect the freshly laid eggs from the chickens. The children had a great day and learnt lots about animals and how our food gets from farm to fork.

Year 3 Memorable Experience

In Art & Design this half term, Year 3 were taught how to use a variety of painting techniques, including tonking, impasto and sgraffito. Pupils explored how to combine techniques to create texture and shape. At the end of the unit, pupils listened to and responded to a story about an imaginary creature, then, combining all previously learned skills and techniques, they used paint and drawing marks to create a portrait of an imaginary creature.



We have now started our printmaking unit and children have been creating experimental marks with rollers using ink on paper. They will continue with this unit next half term, creating monoprints before making their own printing blocks and printing on different surfaces!






Year 4 Memorable Experience
